HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Stay human! 3rd edition is a Human Rights education programme that connects both theory and real life practice in a non-formal programme. Most of all, Stay Human connects countries, partners and relevant human rights topics. Stay Human! 3rd edition is the successor of the Stay Human! Human Right Education Programme 1 and 2 that took place in 2016 and 2017. The 1st and 2nd edition have created a growing "Stay Human" community of young EU people that started to organise local and EU activities.

General Objectives

- In accordance with the Council of Europe, we wish to empower young people to become responsible citizens, educators and advocates for human rights.
- We aim to show how human rights issues differ on a regional level and to gain a better understanding of the historical and geographical aspects of human rights matters.
- We want to create awareness among young people about Human Rights and stimulate them to take an active role in promoting, educating & advocating these rights in their local realities.

City of Today (Gentrification)

Cities for few decades have been associated with opportunities which motivate people to move. More funds are being thrown into the development of neighbourhoods trying to ensure proper housing, access to public services for the influx of people (mostly young). But in the meanwhile, the indigenous communities are being deprived, displaced, restricted access to local social, health services. Young people become even more vulnerable in these situations. With this exchange, we aim to have a critical look at such developments, raise awareness of how our choices and actions might influence this development and try to find ways to engage with local communities and coexist together. Valencia (Spain) is a particularly good location as it has neighbourhoods going through different stages of gentrification.
