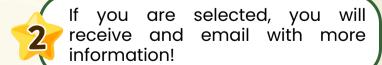

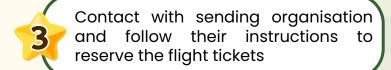
Through this cooperation, we want to give **equal chances for everyone** to become a changemaker, to promote European values, and to fight discrimination through shared actions for a better and cleaner world.

The Youth Exchange "Renewable & Youth" will take place from 13th to 21st December 2025 (including travel days) in Eskişehir, Türkiye.

It will bring together 36 young people from Germany, Türkiye, Portugal, Hungary, Denmark, and Italy.

This project was created as a response to growing need to protect the environment and to include young people Cut down on waste by choosing in taking action for our planet.

By learning together, we hope to build a more sustainable, inclusive, and united Europe, where youth are ready to make a real difference in their communities.

The **main aim** of the project is to help young people:



Learn and share knowledge about environmental protection and sustainability



Opt for second-hand or repurposed items whenever possible



REDUCE

Properly sort and recycle reusable over disposable items plastics, paper, metals, and glass



Save water and energy by adopting efficient habits at home and work



Plant trees and support local reforestation efforts to restore ecosystems

- Learn and grow through non-formal education and teamwork.
- Develop green habits and understand how to live in a more sustainable way.
- Increase their awareness about environmental problems and possible solutions.
- Support social inclusion, giving equal chances to young people with fewer opportunities.

Increase environmental awareness

Help young people understand how their daily choices, food, clothes, transport, and consumption, affect the planet.

Promote sustainable habits

Encourage participants to use eco-friendly products, recycle, and reduce waste in daily

Learn through non-formal education

Use creative workshops, games, and teamwork to make learning fun and practical.

Connect youth from different countries

Create a safe space for cultural exchange, respect, and cooperation between people from different backgrounds.

Include young people with fewer opportunities

Give a chance for everyone to take part, especially those who face social or economic difficulties.

Develop leadership and teamwork skills

Support participants in becoming active citizens and future leaders in their communities

Support European values

Promote peace, respect, inclusion, and unity through shared environmental actions.



36 participants from **6 countries**, each national team consists in 5 youngsters (including 2 fewer opportunities participants) and 1 group leader.

N PARTICIPANTS AGE

All **youngsters** will be aged between **18 and 30 years old**, while **group leaders** must be **at least 18 years old** (can be over 30 years old).

GENDER BALANCE

Will be strictly maintain the **50/50 gender balance** through careful selection by all partner organizations.

LANGUAGE

All selected participants need to demonstrate **basic communication skills** in both spoken and written **English**.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- First-timers welcome! Never done Erasmus+ before? Perfect!
- Passionate about nature? If you care about the environment, we want you!
- Team player? We value everyone's unique background and ideas.
- Like helping out? Volunteer experience is a plus (but not required).
- Want to demonstrate your culture? Ready to share traditions and learn others? Awesome!
- Creative and digital? Participants with skills in photography, video shooting, and editing are especially welcome, your talent can help us share our project results and stories.

Bonus points if you:

- Volunteer for eco-causes
- Recycle/upcycle at home
- Enjoy meeting new people

PARTICIPANTS BACKGROUND

THE PROJECT WILL OFFER A PLATFORM TO SHOWCASE PARTICIPANTS FROM DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS, ALL DRIVEN TO ENGAGE IN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND ENHANCE THEIR PERSONAL COMPETENCIES, KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES IN THE FIELD OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.



This project is a chance to involve fewer opportunities. The Erasmus+ Programme aims at promoting equity and inclusion.

Their interest and motivation is enough to be eligible for the project.

PARTICIPATION OCESS leaders support, ganize their travel,

1. PREPARATION PROCESS

- With the group leaders support, participants will organize their travel, swap cool ideas from their countries, and design fun activities for the program.
- During preparation, everyone will research their local eco-issues and put together a lively presentation about their culture and traditions.
- All this prep work happens online together before we meet face-toface.

3. FOLLOW UP PROCESS

- Post your project photos, videos, and stories on social media.
- Run eco-activities in your town (like clean-ups or workshops).
- Share what you learned at schools, NGO's and community events.
- Keep in touch with the other participants from the project for future network.

2. IMPLEMENTATION PROCESS

- Participants must attend ALL project activities.
- Each country team will get their own special day to lead fun learning activities
- Every day participants will practice new skills and write down what they learned.
- Everyone will join together to evaluate the whole project.
- They will use the Youth Pass to officially record all their learnings.
- Participants needs to make a plan to share what we did and tell others about the project.



- Help all participants, especially first-timers and those with fewer opportunities, by clearly explain the project's goals and what to expect.
- Encourage everyone to join in and help design activities together.
- Help create the program's opening sessions about self-discovery through fun, interactive learning.
- Check in regularly with your national team, listen to their concerns, and share their needs with organizers.







Different activities using non-formal education methods will be organised during the whole project. Participants will learn more about sustainable living, responsible consumption, and how our daily habits affect the planet. They will develop critical thinking, become more creative, and learn to work as a team. Together, they will explore today's environmental challenges and find new ideas for a greener and fairer future through practical green actions.



The program will include many non-formal learning methods such as icebreakers, team-building games, group discussions, brainstorming, role plays, simulation games, world café, study visits, creative workshops, intercultural evenings, and daily reflection times. These methods will make learning active, fun, and meaningful for everyone.



To better understand eco-sustainability and consumption habits, participants will work in **small groups**. They will talk about **how our food, fashion, and home products impact the environment**, and they will discover simple ways to change these habits. A simulation game will help them feel how small daily choices can make a big difference for the planet.



Participants will also **share experiences and good ideas during World Café sessions**. Together, they will create digital booklets, videos, and DIY eco-products to inspire others to live in a more sustainable way. The results will be shared with other young people, schools, and NGOs, so the learning continues after the project ends.



During the Youth Exchange "Renewable & Youth", participants will join many fun and educational activities using non-formal learning methods that mix teamwork, games, discussions, and real experiences.

All activities will focus on the main topics of the project:

- Sustainable cities
- & Environmental protection
- A more livable world
- Digital skills





During the Youth Exchange, there will be key activities such as:

ON 1) ICEBREAKERS - LET'S MEET GREEN!

Fun games and name activities to build team spirit and introduce the project themes.

ON 2 DEBATE - HOW OUR CHOICES IMPACT THE PLANET

Discuss how our food, clothes and daily habits affect nature and what we can do better.

ON 3 BRAINSTORMING – RETHINK, REUSE, RENEW

Share ideas on how to reduce waste, recycle, and live more sustainably.

ON 4 CREATIVE WORKSHOP - FOOD AND FASHION FOOTPRINT

Learn about CO₂ footprint, food waste, and sustainable fashion through games and teamwork.

ON (5) DIY WORKSHOP - ECO BEAUTY AND HOME PRODUCTS

Make natural toothpaste, deodorant, and upcycled home goods using safe, eco materials.

ON 6 SIMULATION GAME - CONSUME OR CONSERVE?

Experience how daily choices can help or harm the planet.

ON 7 WORLD CAFÉ – IDEAS FOR A GREEN EUROPE

Small group discussions to share good eco-practices from each country.

ON 8 DIGITAL CREATION - GREEN MESSAGES IN ACTION

Create videos, photos, or digital booklets to share what was learned with others.

ON 9 ROLE PLAY - MY ECO-FRIENDLY COMMUNITY

Act out everyday situations to find creative green solutions together.

- Find your "cultural twin" (Who else loves spicy in everything?

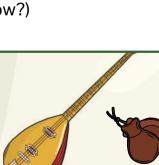

Participants will be gathered at Rota Business Hotel. Participants will share a bedroom with individual beds, the number per room will change depending on the type of room, but normally rooms will be shared between 3-4 people from the same gender. Accommodation and food (breakfast, 2 coffee breaks, lunch, and dinner) are %100 covered by Erasmus+ Programme, between 14th-20th December 2025. Additionally, on arrival day (13th June) there will be only dinner, and on departure day (21st June) there will be only breakfast.







It is possible for participants to stay longer in Turkey (2 extra days maximum) being all costs (for food, accommodation, transportation, or other types of costs not related to project) must be covered by the participant.



Please note that the project officialy will start at 13th of December 2025, participants need to be at hotel no later than 20:00
